n 1972, the Chattanooga-Hamilton County Medical Society joined forces with the Chattanooga Area Hospital Council and the Chattanooga Jaycees to create an organization that would ensure the availability of a life-giving resource to the residents of the Tri-State Area. The bold initiative envisioned by these

three organizations became Blood Assurance. For almost four decades, Blood Assurance has been providing a safe and adequate supply of blood and blood components, in a cost effective manner, to every area patient in need.

Through a system of dedicated volunteers, Blood Assurance now operates as a non-profit, full-service regional blood center serving 56 health care facilities in 32 counties in Tennessee, Georgia, Alabama, and North Carolina. The organization is a member of national, state, and local blood and blood products providers, including the American Association of Blood Banks, America's Blood Centers. the Tennessee Association of Blood Banks, the Tennessee Hospital Association, and the Chattanooga Area Hospital Council. Licensing through the Tennessee Department of Public Health, the Georgia Department of Human Resources, and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration ensures that Blood Assurance meets the most stringent national and state healthcare standards.

Blood Assurance operates twelve conveniently located donation centers in Tennessee, Georgia, and Alabama. In addition, colorful mobile units are scheduled on-site at businesses, organizations, and schools throughout the area to make blood donation more convenient.

Blood Assurance has also been a member of the National Marrow Donor Program since 1993 working diligently to recruit bone marrow/stem cell donors to help save the lives of many patients in need of life saving transplants. The compassion and the volunteer spirit of the
